<b>Acer buergeranum</b>	Trident Maple	15-20' h x w
<b>Acer circinatum</b>	Vine Maple	12-15' h x 10' w, native, prefers pm shade
<b>Acer glabrum</b>	Rocky Mountain Maple	20-25' h x 15' w
<b>Acer grandidentatum 'Schmidt'</b>	Rocky Mountain Glow Big Tooth Maple	20-25' h x 15' w, heat/drought tolerant
<b>Acer griseum</b>	Paperbark Maple	25' h x 20' w, amazing bark and fall color
<b>Acer japonicum</b>	Full Moon Maple	20'h x 25' w
<b>Acer palmatum</b>	Japanese Maple	15-25' h x w (variable)- many cultivars
<b>Acer shirasawanum 'Autumn Moon'</b>	Autumn Moon Fullmoon Maple	8-15' h x w - golden/chartreuse/pink foliage
<b>Acer tataricum ssp. ginnala</b>	Amur Maple	15-20' h x 15' w, red samaras in summer & fall color, heat/drought tolerance
<b>Albizia julibrissin 'EH Wilson'</b>	Mimosa or Silk Tree	20-35' h x w, extra hardy form
<b>Amelanchier grandiflora (like 'Autumn Brilliance' &amp; 'Princess Diana')</b>	Serviceberry	15-20' h x 15' w, early white flwrs, great fall color, birds love berries
<b>Amelanchier laevis 'Spring Flurry'</b>	Spring Flurry Serviceberry	28' h x 20' w, good tree form
<b>Betula nigra 'Little King'</b>	Fox Valley Dwarf River Birch	10'h x 12'w
<b>Carpinus caroliniana 'Native Flame'</b>	American Hornbeam	20-30'h x 20' w, slow growing, tolerant of wet soil
<b>Carpinus japonica</b>	Japanese Hop Hornbeam	15-30'h x w, slow growing, hop-like seed pods
<b>Cercis canadensis 'Ace of Hearts'</b>	Dwarf Eastern Redbud	9-12' h x 12-15' w
<b>Cercis canadensis (including 'Forest Pansy')</b>	Eastern Redbud and Purple Leaved form	20-25' h x w
<b>Cercis can. ssp. texensis (like 'Alba', 'Merlot' &amp; 'Oklahoma')</b>	Texas Redbud	20' h x 25' w, 'Merlot' is 18'h x 20' w, better species for our climate
<b>Cercis occidentalis</b>	Western Redbud	15' h x 10'w, heat/drought tolerant large shrub
<b>Chilopsis linearis (like 'Bubba' and 'Burgundy')</b>	Desert Willow	15-20' h x w, super heat/drought/deer resistance, showy blooms all summer
<b>Chionanthus retusus</b>	Chinese Fringe Tree	15-20 h x 20-25' w, late spring bloom, peeling bark
<b>Chionanthus r. 'Tokyo Tower'</b>	Columnar Chinese Fringe Tree	15-20' h x 10' w, white blooms late spring/blue berries
<b>Chitalpa tashkentensis 'Pink Dawn', 'Morning Cloud'</b>	Chitalpa	15-20' h x w, heat/drought tolerant, blooms all summer
<b>Cornus florida</b>	Flowering Eastern Dogwood	15-25' h x w, depends on the cultivar

<b>Cornus kousa</b>	Chinese Kousa Dogwood	15-25' h x w, depends on the cultivar, more heat tolerant/disease resistant
<b>Cornus mas</b>	Cornelian Cherry	18-20' h x 22' w, very early yellow flwrs, red fruits in fall/winter
<b>Cornus x 'Eddie's White Wonder'</b>	Eddie's White Wonder Dogwood (C. nuttallii x C. florida)	25' h x 20' w, better heat tolerance, huge flwrs
<b>Cornus x 'Venus'</b>	Venus Dogwood (C. nuttallii x C. kousa)	25 h x 20' w, better heat tolerance, huge flwrs
<b>Cotinus coggygria 'Royal Purple'</b>	Royal Purple Smoketree	12-15' h x w, can be pruned into a single/multi tree
<b>Cotinus coggygria x obovatus 'Grace'</b>	Grace Smoketree	12-15' h x w
<b>Crataegus crus-galli v. inermis 'Cruzam'</b>	Crusader Thornless Hawthorn	15-20' h x w, broadly rounded, white flwrs, red berries
<b>Crataegus laevigata 'Paul's Scarlet'</b>	Paul's Scarlet Hawthorn	22'h x 20'w, showy magenta blooms spring, red berries
<b>Crataegus l. 'Crimson Cloud'</b>	Crimson Cloud Hawthorn	25' h x 18'w, dark pink flwrs, red berries, wavy branches
<b>Crataegus v. 'Winter King'</b>	Winter King Thornless Hawthorn	20' h x 25' w, vase shape, thornless
<b>Davidia involucrata</b>	Dove/Hankerchief Tree	20-25' h x 15' w, late spring blooms w/unusually large white bracts, rust colored berries
<b>Elaeagnus angustifolia</b>	Russian Olive	15-20'h x w, tolerant of heat, drought & range of poor soils
<b>Fagus sylvatica 'Weeping Purple'</b>	Purple Weeping Beech	10'h x 15'w
<b>Fraxinus excelsior 'Aureafolia'</b>	Golden Desert European Ash	20' h x 18'w, yellow stems/bark, gold foliage spring/fall
<b>Ginkgo b. 'Mariken'</b>	Dwarf Ginkgo	2-3'h x 3-6' w, male, gold fall color, natural bonsai
<b>Ginkgo b. Chase Manhattan'</b>	Dwarf Ginkgo	3' h x w, slow growing, perfect for rock garden, gold in fall
<b>Ginkgo b. 'Mariken'</b>	Dwarf Ginkgo	2-3'h x 3-6' w, male, gold fall color, natural bonsai
<b>Hamamelis x intermedia</b>	Witch Hazel	10-12'h x w, unique winter bloom + fall color
<b>Heptacodium miconoides</b>	Seven-Son Flower	15'h x w, late summer bloom, peeling bark, best with pm shade
<b>Hibiscus syriacus</b>	Rose of Sharon	8-12'h x 6-10'w, can be pruned into a tree, summer bloom
<b>Koelreuteria paniculata</b>	Goldenrain Tree	25-30'h x w, yellow summer bloom
<b>Laburnum x watereri 'Vossii'</b>	Vossii Goldenchain Tree	25'h x 20'w, vase shaped, yellow flowers
<b>Lagerstroemia varieties</b>	Crepe Myrtle	12-25'h x w, size is cultivar dependent, summer bloom + fall color
<b>Maackia amurensis 'Starburst'</b>	Starburst Amur Maackia	25'h x 20'w, vase shaped, early summer bloom, nitrogen fixer

<b>Magnolia acuminata 'Yellow Bird'</b>	Yellow Bird Magnolia	25-40'h x 20-25'w
<b>Magnolia x (like 'Genie' and 'Susan')</b>	Hybrid Deciduous Magnolia	10'h x 6-10'w, size is dependent on cultivar
<b>Magnolia loebneri 'Leonard Messel'</b>	Leonard Messel Magnolia	20'h x w, pink flwrs
<b>Magnolia sieboldii</b>	Oyama Magnolia	10-20' h x 15-20' w, stunning ivory flwrs w/red stamens, pendulent reddish seed pods follow
<b>Magnolia stellata (many varieties)</b>	Star Magnolia	15'h x 10'w, shrubby habit
<b>Malus spp. (and varieties....so many)</b>	Crab Apple	10-25'h x w, size is cultivar dependent, spring bloom, fall berries
<b>Morus alba 'Chaparral'</b>	Chaparral Weeping Fruitless Mulberry	12'h x 16'w, tolerant of harsh conditions
<b>Nyssa sylvatica</b>	Black Tupelo, Sour Gum	30-35'h x 20'w but SLOW, tolerant of poor drainage, RED fall color
<b>Oxydendrum arboreum</b>	Sourwood	20-30'h x 15'w, late summer bloom, red fall color
<b>Parrotia persica</b>	Persian Ironwood	25-30'h x 20'w, rainbow fall color
<b>Parrotia p. 'Vanessa'</b>	Columnar Persian Ironwood	15-30'h x 10'w, slow growing, tighter form
<b>Physocarpus opulifolius 'Summerwine', 'Coppertina'</b>	Ninebark (Tree-form)	6-10+' h x 6-8' w, dark foliage, spring blooms, exfoliating bark (shown off in standard form)
<b>Pistacia chinensis (including 'Keith Davey' male strain)</b>	Chinese Pistache	30'h x w, heat/drought tolerant, good fall color
<b>Populus tremuloides</b>	Quaking Aspen	30'h x 15'w
<b>Prunus cerasifera 'Purple Pony'</b>	Dwarf Purple Leaf Plum	12-15'h x w, NO fruit!
<b>Prunus c. 'Crimson Pointe'</b>	Columnar Purple Leaf Plum	20-25'h x 10'w, white spring blooms, marron fruit
<b>Prunus cerasifera 'Krauter Vesuvius'</b>	Krauter Vesuvius Purple Leaf Plum	20'h x 15'w
<b>Prunus sargentii 'Columnaris'</b>	Columnar Sargent Cherry	35'h x 15'w
<b>Prunus serrulata (like 'Kwanzan' &amp; 'Royal Burgundy')</b>	Flowering Cherry	20-30'h x 15-25'w depending on variety
<b>Prunus x 'Snofozam'</b>	Snow Fountains Weeping Cherry	12'h x w
<b>Prunus subhirtella 'Pendula Plena Rosea'</b>	Double Weeping Cherry	25'h x w, can be pruned to stay smaller
<b>Prunus virginiana (including 'Canada Red')</b>	Chokecherry (and Red-Leaf Chokecherry)	25'h x 20'w, foliage emerges green and matures to burgundy
<b>Prunus x yedoensis 'Akebono'</b>	Akebono Cherry	25'h x w
<b>Punica granatum</b>	Pomegranate	10-15'h x w, can be pruned into a tree
<b>Pyrus c. 'Jaczam'</b>	Jack Dwarf Flowering Pear	16'h x 10'w
<b>Rhamnus f. 'Asplenifolia' (tree form)</b>	Fernleaf Alder Buckthorn	10-15'h x 6-10'w, ferny foliage turns gold in fall + berries
<b>Rhamnus purshiana</b>	Cascara	15-30'h 6-10'w, highly adaptable, birds love berries

<b>Salix caprea 'Pendula'</b>	Weeping Pussy Willow	6-8' h x w
<b>Sorbus aucuparia</b>	European Mountain Ash	35'h x 20'w, abundant red-orange fruit in fall
<b>Stewartia pseudocamellia</b>	Japanese Stewartia	25-30'h x 15-20'w, needs pm shade
<b>Styrax j. 'Fragrant Fountain'</b>	Weeping Japanese Snowbell	6-10'h x 5-8'w, fragrant late spring bloom, gold in fall
<b>Styrax japonicus (including 'Pink Chimes')</b>	Japanese Snowbell	23-30'h x w (15'hxw for Pink Chimes)
<b>Styrax obassia</b>	Fragrant Snowbell	25'h x 20'w, larger leave and flwrs than S. japonicus
<b>Syringa pekinensis (like 'China Snow' &amp; 'Zhang Zhiming')</b>	China Snow & Beijing Gold Chinese Tree Lilac	20'h x w, late spring bloom attracts pollinators, cool bark
<b>Syringa reticulata 'Ivory Silk'</b>	Ivory Silk Tree Lilacs	20'h x 15'w
<b>Vitex agnus castus</b>	Chaste Tree	12-15'h x w shrub, up to 20' for tree, reliably deer resistant
<b>Ulmus propinqua 'JFS-Bieberich'</b>	Emerald Sunshine Elm	35'h x 25'w, vase shaped, beetle/disease resistant
<b>Zelkova serrata 'City Sprite' &amp; 'Schmidflow'</b>	City Sprite and Wireless Dwarf Zelkova	24'h x 18'w / 24'h x 36'w respectively
<b>BROADLEAF EVERGREENS</b>		
<b>Arbutus unedo</b>	Strawberry Tree	10-15'h x w (6-8' for 'Compacta')
<b>Arctostaphylos spp. (like 'Austin Griffiths', 'Lester Rowntree' and 'Dr. Hurd')</b>	Manzanita	8-12+' h x w, depends on cultivar
<b>Camellia japonica</b>	Japanese Camellia	with patience can be pruned into a tree
<b>Eucalyptus spp. (like E. stellulata &amp; E. coccifera)</b>	Eucalyptus	15-25'h x 10-15'w
<b>Fremontodendron californicum</b>	California Flannel Bush	15'h x w, super droughty/deer resistant, large yellow blooms
<b>Laurus nobilis</b>	Bay Laurel	12-30'h x 10-15'w, classic cooking herb
<b>Leptospermum namadgiensis</b>	Hardy Tea Tree	can be pruned into a tree
<b>Magnolia grandiflora 'Little Gem' (and others)</b>	Little Gem Magnolia	20-25'h x 10-15'w
<b>Olea europea 'Arbequina'</b>	Arbequina Olive	10-15'h x w, hardiest for our area, self-fertile
<b>Osmarea x burkwoodii (aka Osmanthus)</b>	False Holly	6-8' h x w, can be pruned into a tree
<b>Quercus chrysolepis/wislizenii</b>	Canyon/Interior Live Oak	15-45+'h x w, slow growing native
<b>Quercus suber</b>	Cork Oak	40-70'h x w but SLOWLY
<b>Umbellularia californica</b>	California Bay Laurel	8-30'h x w, slow native (larger at coast)
